
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What is Title I?

Winston Elementary is identified as a Title I School, as defined by Every Child Succeeds Act of 2017 (ESSA). How is it developed? The Parent and Family Engagement Policy was developed as a collaborative effort between staff members, parents, community members and students. WES welcomes input and comments at any time regarding the Parent Involvement Plan. Suggestions, comments and concerns can be shared during Parent Advisory Council meetings. To collect written feedback, comment sheets are located in the Main Office and are distributed at each parent workshop. In addition, an annual on-line survey is used to gather suggestions and input regarding the plan and the use of funds for parental involvement. These comments are shared with school leaders and used to revise the plan for the upcoming school year.

Who is it for? All Winston students, their families, and community members are invited and encouraged to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. WES will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents with limited English, parents with disabilities and parents of migratory children.

Where is it available? Winston's Parent and Family Engagement Policy and Douglas County's Parent and Family Engagement Plan are distributed to each student at the beginning of each school year. The plan is also accessible in various formats throughout the year. Copies of the plan can be found in our front office and is posted on our school website. In addition to the Parent and Family Engagement Policy, the School-Parent Compact is given to all students.

2023-2024 District Goal

The percentage of students scoring at Proficient or Distinguished Learner on the Georgia Milestones (GMAS) English Language Arts and Math End of Grade Assessments will increase by six percentage points.

2023-2024 School Goal

Based upon the data from 2022-2023, the following goals have been set for the students at Winston:

The percentage of students scoring at Proficient Learner or above on the GMAS in English Language Arts and Mathematics will increase by six percentage points.

The focus for English/Language Arts is to:

- increase each student's writing proficiency in language, usage, and convention development.
- increase each student's understanding of stories that are read independently.

The focus for Mathematics is:

for students to be able to recall basic math facts fluently.

School-Parent Compacts
